<p style="text-align: center;">Reading</p> <p>Continue to read your school book (or any book you have at home) at least three times a week.</p> <p>Share a story with your grown up and talk about the main characters within it.</p> <p>Complete the three assigned tasks on Reading Eggs.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Writing</p> <p>Draw and label a fairy tale character of your choice.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Maths</p> <p>Number: Show me different ways to make the number 8. Ideas we often explore in class are 8 dots on a tens frame/ writing the number/writing the word, tally of 8, picture of 8 objects, two dice, 8 Numicon, photograph of 8 objects, number sentences $4 + 4 = 8$. See Number 8 Powerpoint for further support.</p> <p>Shape, Space and Measure: Create a repeating pattern using items around your house (colours, paints, chalk, beads, Lego blocks)</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">Creative</p> <p>Make a puppet of your favourite fairy tale character (finger puppet/wooden spoon puppet)</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Understanding the World</p> <p>Make a weather chart to show what the Spring weather is like. You could print out and cut out the symbols from the sheet attached to stick on your chart, or you could draw a picture of the weather each day.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">MFL</p> <p>Learn to sing the alphabet in French this week. Use Basho and Friends French alphabet (You Tube). Practise for 10 mins per day. Try to spell your name using the French alphabet sounds. Try to spell family names. Practise with a sibling. Test each other. Write the letters out and choose one. Say it in French. Perform the alphabet on day 5.</p>
