You can print out and write them on the attached sheets or draw the characters into your exercise book or on paper and write speech bubbles for them.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Maths</b></p> <p><b>Number:</b> Show me different ways to make the number 10 (10 dots on a tens frame/ writing the number/writing the word, tally of 10, picture of 10 objects, two dice, 10 Numicon, photograph of 10 items, number bond links <math>7 + 3 = 10</math>, doubles <math>5 + 5 = 10</math>.
