<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Reading</b></p> <p>Continue to read your school book, a book you have at home or perhaps an Oxford Owl e-book online at least three times a week.</p> <p>Share a story with your grown up. Discuss with your grown up which part of the story you liked the most and why?</p> <p>Complete the three assigned tasks on Reading Eggs.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Writing</b></p> <p>Listen to the story 'Ten Little Pirates' using the link below:  <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=VLpC0rUSB18">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=VLpC0rUSB18</a></p> <p>Choose your favourite pirate from the story and write a sentence to describe him or her.</p> <p>You can print out and complete the activity on the attached sheets or draw your favourite character into your exercise book or on paper and write your description underneath.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Maths</b></p> <p><b>Number:</b> Show me different ways to make the number 16 (writing the number/writing the word, show on four hands, tally of 16, double 8, find 16 objects, show on two tens frames, towers of cubes, ten and six Numicon, Numberblocks '10' and '6', grouping 16 items in different ways, e.g. 9 and 7/ 10 and 6). <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Expressive Arts and Design/ Understanding the World</b></p> <p>Create a Pirate boat of your choice that will 'float' on water (sticks, cork, sponge scourer, folded paper, plastic tub, water, tin foil, egg carton etc)</p> <p>Test your creation in a bowl of water or water tray. Is it able to float on its own?</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>PSED/ Communication and Language</b></p> <p>Work through the Fowley's Wings Jigsaw activity session with your grown up. For example Fish and chips would be clap, clap, clap.</p>

### **Create Your Own Paint:**

1. In a mixing bowl, combine even parts of water, salt and flour.
2. Once fully combined, funnel the mixture into a bottle.
3. Place small drops of food colouring into each bottle and shake to mix the paint.
